# MP praises Gawsworth Hub

Celebrating the important role of community stores and local volunteers was at the top of the agenda when Macclesfield MP David Rutley recently visited Gawsworth Hub.

During the visit, David met with members of the Board including the Chairman, Neil Phillips and other local volunteers.

The visit was prompted following the launch of the Association of Convenience Stores Rural Shop Report 2024. This report outlines the difference that rural shops make as both local employers and champions of their communities.

Speaking after the visit David said, "Community stores play a vital role in village life. Gawsworth Hub goes a step further with a wide array of initiatives on offer.

I am grateful to all the many volunteers who make this possible and I hope local residents continue to actively use their services and support upcoming events."





### New Conservation Area Appraisal approved

The revised Gawsworth Conservation Area has been approved by Cheshire East Council.

The Conservation Area was first designated in 1969, making it one of the earliest in the country following the Civic Amenities Act 1967. The Parish Council commissioned a review, residents were consulted and the outcome essentially confirms recommendations from 2007 for boundary changes that were accepted by the planning authority but never formalised.

The new assessment cements, in planning terms, the importance of the conservation area, complementing the Cheshire East Strategic Plan and our Neighbourhood Plan from May 2021. The changes have been to include:

a) the length of Church Lane running north from Gawsworth New Hall to the crossroads with Maggoty Lane, and the tree/ hedgerow corridor either side of it;

b) part of a field to the north of Oak Cottage;

c) two small parcels of land northeast and north-west of New Hall Barn.

The Conservation Area Appraisal is an interesting read and includes a concise history of Gawsworth, information on our listed buildings and some rather nice photographs. You can find it in the Conservation Area part of the Cheshire East Council website.

## Parish Council Report

Gawsworth Parish Council meets on the second Tuesday each month in the Village Hall. Here's a round up of the March meeting.

During public speaking time at our March meeting, a resident highlighted the need for clearer "no dog" signage for the park – two new signs are now on order. Dogs are welcome in Nancy's Wood, but not in Gawsworth Park and we request all users respect this.

One of the main items discussed at the meeting was funding an initial survey of land to support a potential extension of the churchyard. The council agreed to fund this survey. We also agreed we will work with the PCC to develop an options paper to help both the council and PCC make decisions on whether the churchyard should be extended.

The council also agreed a number of actions in relation to Gawsworth Park (see a full write

Finally, the council discussed the issue of the land slippage on Church Lane by the pools. Cheshire East Council will be repairing the kerbs at some point in the future, and we have written to owner of the pools requesting they repair the fencing.

## Parish Council Report

Plans to deliver improvements to Gawsworth Park and renovate the play area were discussed at the March council meeting.

The play area was installed in 2005 and is now of an age where much of it needs replacement, the council is extremely conscious that the zip-wire is out of action and the play area is not looking its best.

This will be a major project and the first stage is identifying the available budget. An initial quote we've had for what we hope to achieve is £135k. The council has £37k set aside and some grant opportunities have been identified, but it is likely we'll have to make some decisions on what is a priority to work within the available budget. We'll consult on options once we have them to share with the community.

Our initial aims are to replace the multi-play units, install a new zipwire and replace the roundabout and some swing seats. We would also like to add a trampoline, rope climbing unit and some imaginative play panels.

In the interim, some 'quick wins' will also be progressed. One plan is to reopen the Church Lane entrance to the park so people can directly access the community orchard - if you have any views on this please email clerk@gawsworthpc.org.uk. We will also be installing two benches in this section so visitors can enjoy the space, and we'll be looking to add some soft fruit bushes too.

re-align the goal posts which are (for some reason) askew. We are also looking at starting to line the pitch again, and undertaking some general pitch maintenance.

Other plans for the future include relocating the picnic tables closer to the play area, installing some gym equipment and resurfacing the path and revamping the basketball area. We'll also explore options for a shelter and creating a nature trail - these ideas will all be developed once the play area project is complete.
