A couple of Gawsworth planning applications are causing concerned locals to raise their voices to object.

A recently purchased field off Woodhouse End Road adjacent to the sunken lane footpath to the Danes Moss SSSI has been designated as 'Birch Tree Farm' and 'prior approval' for a machinery barn was granted last summer.

Applications are in for a temporary agricultural workers dwelling and a livestock barn. You can view the details and comment if you wish on the Cheshire East Council Planning Portal using


