Council have voted to

Cheshire Wildlife Trust

An open meeting, as part of the February Parish Council meeting, heard about possibilities for a nature recovery zone with open spaces, wet woodland and new paths and board walks. Included in the plan is a new footpath linking the

proposed North Danes Moss Nature Recovery Zone with the existing SSSI nature reserve. This would complete a walking route between two parts of Gawsworth Parish, from Penningtons Lane across to the Nature Reserve. Councillors were impressed with the positive effect the proposal could have on the health and well-being of Gawsworth residents as well as the benefits
