Gawsworth Highways

The Parish Council resolved, at its January meeting, to input to the Cheshire East Council Transformation work by writing to stress the importance of working closely with Parish Councils at a practical and day to day level.

A few days later an opportunity to put this into practice came when Parish Councillor Paul Woods was invited by Ward Councillor Lesley Smetham to join a meeting with the Head of Cheshire East Highways Dominic de Bechi and senior members of his team.

Cllr Woods said "It was helpful to meet some key people at Highways who are dealing with issues involving our roads and footways and to understand better the challenges they face and how they work. I was impressed with their knowledge of our local issues despite their

huge workload. We were able to emphasize our willingness to use our local knowledge and contacts to help the Highways team in their work"

Gawsworth issues that were discussed in considerable detail were the spring and recurrent flooding on Lowes Lane as well as reinstatement of the verges following damage from motorists ignoring signage during the recent road closures and temporary lights at Gawsworth crossroads. Also discussed were the repair of the collapsed retaining wall in the park by the verge of the A536, the rotting tree stump on Woodhouse End Road and siding out the footway on the A536 north of Gawsworth crossroads.

We also asked that Highways do all they can to urge the Canal and River Trust to expedite their work



on the Fools Nook canal bridge in the light of the inconvenience to residents and damage to Cowbrook Lane that is being caused.

Paul commented "There were no instant solutions but I feel that progress was made on each of the issues we raised. On behalf of residents, the Gawsworth representatives were able to thank the Highways team for their work on the Safer Roads scheme through Gawsworth. The Parish Council undertook to reflect on the 8 year project and to feedback thoughts and learning points on optimising working relationships with residents' representatives."



Meet Councillor Webb

Gawsworth Parish Council welcomed its newest councillor in January.

Deborah Webb (Deb) lives on Woodhouse Lane and applied to be co-opted to the council to fill a vacancy following Gordon Mitchell stepping down last year.

Deb spoke of feeling "very lucky to live in Gawsworth"

and wanting to use her time to give back to the community. Deb joined the council to be of help in maintaining the village, and preserving its unique environment and to be of use to the community.

The Parish Council warmly welcomed Deb to the team and thanked her for volunteering for the role.

Gawsworth in Bloom

A small group of Gawsworth residents has got together to improve the appearance of our various green areas.

They have joined forces with our park's community garden team and plan 'planting parties' which will enhance our natural environment and bring some more colour to our village.

At the January meeting the Parish Council was impressed with the project aims and how they fitted perfectly with the strategic plan for Gawsworth. The council was pleased to be able to provide a grant to the group to purchase bulbs, plants, seeds etc. A grant

for a small shed to be placed in the park was also agreed.

Marion Oliver, who hatched the plan, said "We are delighted that we will have the resources to start the work of making our village an even more attractive environment for all. Come the spring we'll put out a call for volunteers from all parts of Gawsworth, including the Penningtons Lane area, to undertake the sewing and planting."

Brenda Hughes, who led the hard work to make the community garden a reality, added "Having a small shed to store our compost, wheel barrow etc will really make



our work a lot easier"

Parish Council News

It was another busy council meeting in January for the Parish Council.

Residents of Lowes Lane attended to highlight the significant problems they are facing with the condition of the road and flooding. These concerns are being raised with Cheshire East Council with the parish council pressing them for action.

Cllr Smetham reported that Cheshire East Council had applied for permission from MHCLG to raise council tax by 9.99% (approximately £179 per year for a Band D household) and that the national planning policy changes would require a new local plan and likely result in additional green belt change with an annual housing target for the borough of 2,461 homes.

A review of the Christmas lights was also discussed. It was noted the light arch required replacement in November at significant cost and that

arrangements for the Christmas tree would be additionally expensive this year due to the need for professional support installing it. It was decided to stop providing a Christmas tree in the village but continue with the light arch whilst it remains functional.

The council reviewed a CEC consultation on Housing Strategy, agreeing to comment that affordable housing on strategic development sites on the periphery or within rural parishes should give equal priority to residents of the parishes as to those of the town in order to meet rural housing needs.

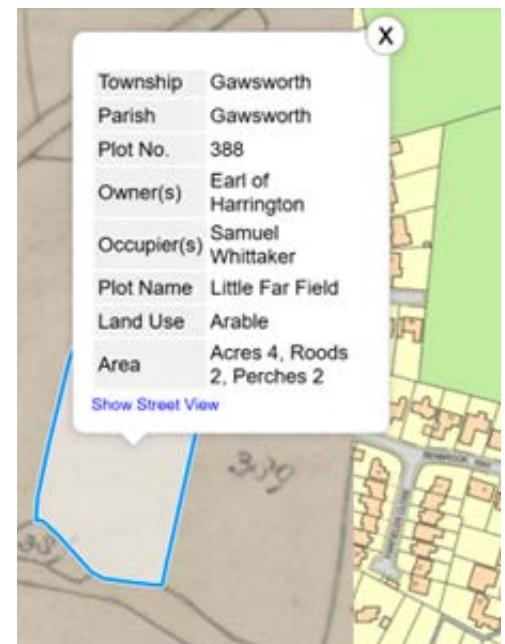
The final main item was setting the parish council budget for 2025/26. The council set a total budget of £48,596, requiring a precept of £43,270 which equates to a Band D charge of £52 per year, an increase of £11.73. The council has had to make additional provision following changes in Employer National Insurance contributions,
