26/056 PRESENT

26/057 APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE

Apologies were received from Cllrs Clarke and Woods

26/058 DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST

No member declared an interest in any item.

26/059 PUBLIC PARTICIPATION

No members of the public wished to address the council.

26/050 APPROVAL OF PREVIOUS MINUTES

Cllr Richards joined the meeting.

It was **RESOLVED** to approve the minutes of the meeting held 14th July.

26/051 CHESHIRE EAST COUNCILLORS REPORT

Cllr Smetham highlighted the recent death of Jane Palmer, who represented Gawsworth on Macclesfield Borough Council until 2009. Cllr Smetham reported that Peak Cluster would be referred to the Cabinet for a decision on the council's view and that Marton Lane had had bin collection issues.

Cllr Kinsey joined the meeting.

The Clerk read a report from Cllrs Puddicombe and Wilson which outlined that works at Moss Lane/Congleton Road junction would have created an additional right hand lane for drivers turning into Moss Lane, meaning drivers turning right out of Moss Lane would have had to cross two lanes of traffic. The works were developer funded but following residents raising concerns it was ascertained that highways drawing made in 2014 which actually showed the reverse, an additional right turn lane for vehicles exiting Moss Lane. After the councillors raised it with the interim Chief Executive the work was cancelled and the developer has agreed a contribution to the council in lieu of the works being undertaken and a review of potential improvements will now be undertaken. The report further noted that the first meeting of the Place Overview and Scrutiny Committee considered changes to the HWRCs booking system where they sent in a statement highlighting concerns regarding traffic congestion and highway safety at the Macclesfield HWRC and the need for urgent mitigation measures and engagement with local ward members and parish councils. The Director of Planning and Environment stated the situation at the Macclesfield site would be kept under review.

26/052 PLANNING

26/2617/VOC – Mill Field, Mill Lane

It was **RESOLVED** to raise no objections.

26/2604/HOUS – Mill Field, Mill Lane

It was **RESOLVED** to raise no objections.

26/2532/VOC – New Venture Farm, Marton Lane

It was **RESOLVED** to raise no objections.

26/2650/PRIOR-3R – New Venture Farm, Marton Lane

It was **RESOLVED** to comment that the council is uncertain as to whether the structure should be regarded as a building for the purposes of permitted development, given the nature of the structure.

26/2677/PRIOR-6 – Trevors Close Farm, Dark Lane

It was **RESOLVED** to raise no objections.

26/053 PEAK CLUSTER PIPELINE

It was noted that there was a perception that the council had not objected to the project. The Clerk confirmed the council had resolved its objections and published an article on the Gawsworth Life website “Parish Council Objects to peak Cluster Proposals”. It was agreed to include an article in the next Gawsworth Gazette clarifying this.

It was noted the council had met with officers from Cheshire East Council where the parish council encouraged the borough council to directly consult parishes on the issues they want to see CEC address in its discussions. Following the meeting, the report which covered CEC's comments to the first consultation was circulated and it was noted that it did not cover the section of the route through Gawsorth. This had been queried with them, and the answer was that the matters were covered in other sections. It was agreed to challenge this and query why so much detail was provided on the other sections and note that it should have stated matters explicitly.

26/054 CHESHIRE EAST LOCAL PLAN

It was **RESOLVED** that the Clerk prepare a response (circulated to members in advance of submission) focused on:

- The timing of consultations avoiding summer/Christmas breaks
- Encouraging public meetings
- Encouraging stronger engagement with town and parish councils
- Promoting active travel measures between Macclesfield and Congleton
- Ensuring parishes with development on the edge of towns have equal priority for affordable housing
- Expressing concern about grey belt definition
- Seeking the protection of peat land, mitigation of impacts on the climate and restoration of the Danes Moss North site
- Council Farms not being promoted for development
- Promoting sustainability measures on new housing
- Highlighting the importance of green belt separating settlements

It was agreed not to take a general view on development within the parish and to look at any proposals on a site-by-site basis should they come forward.

26/055 COMMUNITY SURVEY

The road safety section of the survey was discussed.

It was **RESOLVED** to support 20mph limits around the school, which is advisory, but not support 20mph limits around the rest of the village due to it being excessively urbanising under CEC's current policy.

It was **RESOLVED** to look at the 'crash map' and explore additional signage.

It was **RESOLVED** to:

- a) Explore accessibility of pavements
- b) Review speed limits across the parish

- c) Explore signage at Penningtons Lane advising against using the BOAT section
- d) Explore tackling areas of overgrowth on pavements

26/056 REPLACEMENT BENCHES

It was **RESOLVED** to replace two benches at St James' Green.

26/057 PARISH MATTERS

It was reported that a decision on the extension of the Churchyard was required imminently with a time-limited offer from a resident to part-fund the purchase of the land for an extension.

1.0 BACKGROUND

At the July meeting, the Council considered the headline data from the survey along with the sections on Peak Cluster, the Gawsworth Gazette and Gawsworth Churchyard. In August it considered the report on the road safety section.

This report covers the Parish Maintenance section and the “other matters” section.

2.0 MAINTENANCE

This question was an open question asking if there were any areas within the parish which required attention. The subjects raised are set out below (excluding anything relating to green space which is covered separately) along with suggested action. Where there is no suggested action, the council should consider how to respond to the matter.

Where suggestions have been actioned/resolved (e.g. handrail at Woodhouse Lane) they have not been included.

3.0 OTHER MATTERS

This question was an open question asking if there were any other Gawsworth matters people would like to bring to the attention of the Parish Council.

It should be noted there were a good number of comments thanking the council for the survey and the work councillors do for the community – examples: “I am pleased with the job you are doing now”, “Just to say thank you to the members of the Parish Council for looking after our parish so we'll, i think you do a great job”

The matters raised in this question were (not covered by the previous section, or concerning Peak Cluster):

1. As a resident of gawsworth living in Sussex Avenue I often feel as though we are an unwanted section of the Parish.
2. The Peaks and Plains bungalows have no driveways there are five blue badge holders, school traffic is not just limited to pick up and drop off times. They have numerous events, day and evening - we are finding it impossible to park near our own homes. BB parking for our elderly and disabled residents would make our lives so much easier.
3. Disabled parking at Village Hall are blue badge spaces active at certain times, it appears cars without badges sometimes use them in the evenings.
4. I have often wondered why the school doesn't have a dedicated car park for parents. A section of the playing field adjacent to Congleton road, within the school boundaries would make an ideal site catering for staff, parents and visitors cars and maybe even a turning circle for coaches. A great expense I know but the cost could be found through local, government and school funding with the school and village helping with fund raising events.
5. I would like to highlight the potential danger encountered when turning right into Dark Lane from Macclesfield on the main road at the traffic lights. Very often traffic approaching behind is unaware that you are stationary in the centre of the road hence trucks, vans and cars squeeze by (sometimes mounting the curb) at high speed, and I am concerned this will lead to a very serious accident.
6. Since the introduction of traffic lights at the crossroads Gawsworth Road has been turned into the equivalent of 'Macclesfield bypass'. At peak times queues stretch down Gawsworth Road and Dark Lane and you can taste the vehicle emissions in the air. It is now also noticeable how many taxis use this rural lane as an urban bypass.

7. I would like to see the parish council oppose to the greatest possible extent any proposals for new housing / or any other developments in the entire parish not just village centre
8. In view of the changes in the climate there needs to be closer inspection of trees especially the large beeches and chestnuts. The populous and the Parish Council needs to be aware of their responsibilities with regards to their own trees
9. Stop with trying to urbanise a beautiful village
10. Keep the Gawsworth Parish Council meetings to two hours maximum, have a time conscious, relevant agenda and perhaps parishioners might engage a little more.
11. Management of the traffic for the events at Gawsworth Hall before and after peak shows
12. More bridleways needed, could the parish council consider a bridleway round the football pitches and Dane's Moss area if it's no longer being built on?
13. Gawsworth use to be nice and tidy but it is going to rack and ruin.
14. Only to try and get more of the community to get involved and help in village life so the load can be spread . Maybe a skills bank , that sees someone collate a list of residents who have certain skills that can then help other residents. Particularly elderly people who are vulnerable and lonely . Computer /it /shopping/chatting etc . This may be part of the hubs remit but just need more people to help.
15. Outside noise from parties, BBQs etc after 9.00 pm especially around the Longbutts/ St James areas where there are senior citizens bungalows.
16. The Hub. I am sure the cafe's turnover would increase if dog owners and their dogs could use the facility of the cafe year round.
17. Plant more trees and hedgerows
18. Reduction of posters in village. There are too many item attached to fences and planters when there are plenty of noticeboards throughout the village. They are an eyesore and litter.
19. Remove direction sign at head of Cowbrook Lane - "Bosley 2". This road is not fit for any through traffic which is best directed via Fools Nook.
20. Replacement of more stiles by kissing gates for easy of use/access. Stiles not always negotiable therefore restricts paths for less able
21. Some damage has occurred to scarecrows supposedly by youths from out of area, could consider strategically place CCTV
22. Stop thinking of ideas for more signs everywhere
23. Street lighting on Church Lane around the scout hall and village hall.
24. Streetlights in the village mainly the newer ones on Benbrook, Longbutts, Thornycroft and surrounding roads could be set to turn off during night hours (10pm-5am) to reduce costs for the council and also reduce light pollution in the area which would improve and benefit the environment and wildlife in the village
25. The amount of building work in the village causes significant disruption to those of us trying to live a peaceful life. There is noise early in the morning through to late at night, on weekends and week days. Large trucks and deliveries arrive and cause problems with parking for residents and visitors.
26. Updates on Danes Moss and Penningtons Lane potential developments.
27. The odd times I have watched the proceedings, it is light watching paint dry. The 7 most misused words in the English language - "we have always done it this way"
28. To better highlight areas where public involvement is wanted/ needed either use Nextdoor app, FaceBook or better highlighting in the gazette

29. Tree surveys in the park. I don't know who undertakes the annual tree survey but I am strongly of the opinion that a different company may have another opinion on the condition of some of the trees.
30. Unfortunately many individuals have not been aware of the survey & feel left out of the process.
31. We must, must, must, preserve green belt land around the village and resist the relentless march of greedy land developers who want to build houses on any green field sites (cheap). If we don't robustly resist this, we will be swallowed up by Macclesfield Town and traditional rural village will be no more.
32. We would like to show our concern for Marton Lane. It is a narrow lane, with a 60mph limit, as many as 40-50 if not more large tankers, arctics and curtain siders go past our house 7 days a week from 6am-9pm. The whole of our house shakes and we are constantly filling cracks in the plastic in our rooms through vibration. Do you think there should be a reduction of speed to 30-40mph, it is only time before there will be a very serious accident, we have had a milk tanker overturn at speed and present itself on our lawn. We hope you will give this matter some consideration.
